Through the citywide **"Pitch In Chicago"** day of service, you can make an immediate difference in your local school by volunteering to clean parkways, curb lanes, sidewalks and vacant lots on routes to and from school, outdoor school grounds or other areas around a school near you.



As part of the **"One Good Deed Chicago"** program, Mayor Emanuel and the City of Chicago are asking YOU to pitch in and help get Chicago students, schools and communities ready for back-to-school. It's our responsibility to help keep Chicago safe and clean for years to come.

All you have to do is join with your neighbors and call 3-1-1 to register your **"Pitch In Chicago"** team and the area or school you plan to clean. The City will work with you and your community organization to provide brooms, rakes, shovels and bags to get the job done.

The community cleaning supplies can be picked up at your local Streets and Sanitation Refuse Division Office from 7am to 2pm on Thursday, August 21 and Friday, August 22 or from 7am to 9am on Saturday, August 23.
